6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the Department of Transportation
7 and Public Facilities; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 19.10.190 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 19.10.190. ADVERTISEMENT, BIDS, CONTRACTS, AND INFORMAL BIDS.

12 (a) Except as provided in AS 44.33.300, when the estimated cost of any
13 construction exceeds \$20,000, the department shall, except as provided
14 in sec. 170 of this chapter, proceed to advertise, request bids, and
15 award the contract in the manner provided in secs. 200 and 210 of this
16 chapter. Whenever any proposed construction contract is for a sum less
17 than \$20,000, it is [SHALL BE] discretionary with the department whether
18 the contract is to [SHALL] be advertised and awarded in accordance with
19 secs. 200 and 210 of this chapter.

20 (b) When immediate repairs, maintenance, or materials are needed
21 for a timely completion of a maintenance contract, repair contract,
22 building repair materials contract, or road maintenance contract for a
23 sum less than \$20,000, it is discretionary with the department, AS 37.-
24 05.230 notwithstanding, whether the contract is to be advertised and
25 awarded in accordance with secs. 200 and 210 of this chapter.

26 (c) In applying either (a) or (b) of this section [ALL EVENTS] the
27 department shall request informal bids from as many contractors as can
28 be requested conveniently.

29 (d) A complete record shall be kept by the commissioner or his

1 designee of all transactions entered into under (a)(b) and (c) of this
2 section, including names of employees involved in the transactions.

3 * Sec. 2. If the office or position of a public officer or employee is
4 rendered unnecessary and abolished as a result of the creation of the Depart-
5 ment of Transportation and Public Facilities in accordance with Executive
6 Order No. 39, the employment of the officer or employee is terminated or
7 interrupted, and there is not available to the employee a like position in
8 the same geographic area, severance pay shall be allowed as a lump sum upon
9 separation from service in an amount equal to the compensation the officer or
10 employee would have received if he had remained in service for six months
11 past the date of separation from service.

12 * Sec. 3. If the office or position of a public officer or employee is
13 rendered unnecessary and abolished as a result of the creation of the Depart-
14 ment of Transportation and Public Facilities in accordance with Executive
15 Order No. 39 and if there is not available to the employee a like position in
16 the same geographic area and the officer or employee is terminated, if the
17 officer or employee has completed less than 15 years of credited service he
18 is granted two additional years of credited service for the purpose of
19 calculating the monthly amount of his retirement pension under AS 39.35. If
20 the employee or officer has 15 years or more of credited service, he is
21 granted two additional years of credited service and is eligible for early
22 retirement with no reduction in benefits.

23 * Sec. 4. This Act is retroactive to March 10, 1977.

24 * Sec. 5. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
25 070(c).
