5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act providing for recreational liquor licenses."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 04.10.020 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

9 (p) recreational licenses.

10 * Sec. 2. AS 04.10 is amended by adding a new section to read:

11 Sec. 04.10.148. RECREATIONAL LICENSES. (a) The holder of a
12 recreational license may sell beer and wine for consumption on the pre-
13 mises only. A license under this section may be issued for a premises
14 in which are located facilities for individual or competitive sports or
15 facilities for community recreation, including, but not limited to,
16 bowling alleys.

17 (b) If a premises licensed under this section is located in a
18 municipality or in an unincorporated community having a population of
19 less than 1,500 persons, the annual license fee is \$300. If a premises
20 is located in a municipality or in an unincorporated community having
21 a population of 1,500 persons or more, the annual license fee is \$600.

22 (c) Each applicant for a recreational license shall file with the
23 application a cash bond or surety bond executed by a surety company
24 approved by the board. The condition of the bond or understanding shall
25 be that the applicant or applicants are the sole owners of the business
26 to be licensed, that no other person is financially interested directly
27 or indirectly, and that the applicant or applicants will conduct the
28 business in accordance with applicable laws pertaining to intoxicating
29 liquor in the state. The bond shall be in the penal sum of \$2,500. Upon

1 revocation of a license, the bond shall be forfeited and the amount
2 deposited into the general fund of the state.

3 (d) The sale of beer and wine on premises licensed under this
4 section is prohibited during hours when persons under the age of 19 are
5 present. The holder of the license shall establish the hours during
6 which persons under the age of 19 may be present. The minimum number of
7 hours shall be not less than 50 per cent of the number of hours during
8 which the recreational facilities are available for use by the public.
9 The holder shall post notice of the hours at a conspicuous location
10 within the place of business and may file copy of the notice with the
11 clerk of the municipality and executive director of the board.

12 * Sec. 3. AS 04.15.020 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

13 (i) A person under the age of 19 years may enter and remain upon
14 premises licensed under AS 04.10.148 during hours when beer and wine are
15 offered for sale for the purpose of using recreational facilities pro-
16 vided at the premises only if the minor is accompanied by his parent,
17 guardian, or spouse who has attained the age of 19 years, or by the
18 parent or guardian of any other minor also present, or by any other
19 adult with the consent of the minor's parent or guardian.
