6 For an Act entitled: "An Act authorizing the Alcoholic Beverage Control
7 Board to issue club permits."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 04.10 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10 ARTICLE 6. PERMITS.

11 Sec. 04.10.500. CLUB PERMITS. (a) The board may provide by
12 regulation for the issuance of club permits. A club permit authorizes
13 the organization holding the permit to sponsor social events, for the
14 period of time stipulated in the permit, during which a member of the
15 organization or his guests may consume alcoholic beverages on the
16 premises specified in the permit.

17 (b) A permit issued to an organization under this section does not
18 authorize the sale, offer of sale, supply or provision of alcoholic
19 beverages by the holder of the permit.

20 (c) Only nonprofit civic, service, charitable, fraternal or educa-
21 tional organizations which have been active for a period of not less
22 than one year may receive a permit under this section.

23 (d) Applications for permits under this section must be received
24 by the director of the board at least 30 days before the date the permit
25 is desired. Applications shall be signed and notarized by the president
26 and secretary of the organization, shall be accompanied by an affidavit
27 showing the length of time the organization has been active, and shall
28 include a certified copy of the resolution or other action by the board
29 of directors of the organization authorizing submission of the

1 application.

2 (e) The board may issue a club permit for a single event or for a
3 period of time not to exceed one year. If a permit is issued to an
4 organization authorizing the organization to sponsor more than one
5 event, the organization is limited to the sponsorship of not more than
6 two events during each calendar month for the period prescribed in the
7 permit.

8 (f) A club permit authorized under this section may be issued by
9 the board without regard to secs. 430 - 460 of this section.

10 (g) The provisions of ch. 15 of this title are applicable to
11 organizations receiving permits under this section.

12 (h) The board shall revoke the permit for failure of an organiza-
13 tion to comply with any provision of this section.

14 (i) The board shall, by regulation, determine the fee for a permit
15 authorized by this section. The fee shall not exceed \$25 for each
16 social event sponsored by the holder of the permit for the period of the
17 permit.

18 (j) In this section,

19 (1) "charitable organization" means an organization, not or-
20 ganized for pecuniary profit, which is operated for the relief of po-
21 verty, distress, or other condition of public concern in the state;

22 (2) "civic or service organization" means a branch, lodge or
23 chapter of a national or state organization, not organized for pecuniary
24 profit, and authorized by its written constitution, charter, articles or
25 incorporation, or bylaws to engage in a fraternal, civic, or service
26 purpose in the state;

27 (3) "educational organization" means a civic, service or
28 charitable organization in the state, not organized for pecuniary
29 profit, whose primary purpose is educational in nature and designed to

develop the capabilities of individuals by instruction;

(4) "fraternal organization" means a civic, service or charitable organization of the state, except a high school or college fraternity, not organized for pecuniary profit, which is a branch, lodge or chapter of a national or state organization and exists for the common business, brotherhood, or other interests of its members.
