6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the membership of the Alaska
7 Coastal Policy Council."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 44.19.891(d) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

10 (d) Each member of the council shall select one person to serve
11 as a permanent alternate at meetings of the council. If a member of
12 the council is unable to attend, he shall advise the alternate who
13 may attend and act in the place of the member. The alternate for a
14 public member appointed under (a)(1) of this section shall, at the time
15 of his designation and throughout the period of his service as a perma-
16 nent alternate, be the mayor or member of the assembly or council of a
17 municipality within the region from which the permanent member is
18 appointed. The alternate for a designated member serving under (a)(2)
19 of this section shall be a responsible officer or employee of the
20 department. The names of alternates shall be filed with the council.

21 * Sec. 2. AS 44.19.891(g) is repealed and re-enacted to read:

22 (g) If an incumbent public member ceases to meet the qualifications
23 prescribed under (a)(1) of this section for nomination to the council or
24 if a vacancy exists among the public members for any other reason, the
25 governor shall, within 30 days of the creation of the vacancy by lack
26 of qualification or other reason, make an appointment, to be immediately
27 effective, for the unexpired portion of the term. An appointment by the
28 governor made under this subsection shall comply with the requirements
29 of (a)(1) of this section.
