6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to conflict of interest; and providing
7 for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 39.50.020(a) is amended to read:

10 (a) A judicial officer, commissioner, chairman or member of a
11 state commission or board specified in sec. 200(9) of this chapter,
12 person hired or appointed as head or deputy head of, or director of a
13 division within, a department in the executive branch, person appointed
14 as assistant to the governor, and a municipal officer, shall file a
15 statement giving his income sources and business interests, under oath
16 and on penalty of perjury, within 30 days after he takes office as a
17 public official. Candidates for state elective office shall file such a
18 statement at the time of filing a declaration of candidacy or within 30
19 days of the filing of any nominating petition, or within 30 days of
20 becoming a candidate by any other means. Candidates for state elective
21 office who filed for office during an off-election year shall file
22 another such statement on or before June 1 of the election year.

23 Candidates for elective municipal office shall file such a statement at
24 the time of filing a nominating petition, declaration of candidacy, or
25 other required filing for the elective municipal office. Refusal or
26 failure to file within the time prescribed shall require that the can-
27 didate's filing fees, if any, and filing for office be refused or that
28 his previously accepted filing fee be returned and his name removed from
29 the filing records. A statement shall also be filed by public officials

1 no later than April 15 [OR 15 DAYS AFTER THE PERSON FILES HIS FEDERAL
2 INCOME TAX RETURN] in each following year. Upon termination from a
3 position subject to the reporting requirements of this chapter, a
4 person shall file a statement covering the period from the final date of
5 his last previous statement through the date of his termination [,
6 WHICHEVER SHALL COME FIRST. PERSONS WHO, ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 11, 1974,
7 WERE MEMBERS OF BOARDS OR COMMISSIONS NOT NAMED IN SEC. 200(9) OF THIS
8 CHAPTER ARE NOT REQUIRED TO FILE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS].

9 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
10 070(e).
