6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to defective filings for the 1978
7 primary election; and providing for an effective
8 date."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

11 * Section 1. The legislature finds that some persons attempting to file
12 for the 1978 primary may have been unintentionally, unwittingly, and inad-
13 vertantly misled by the circumstances, that they probably have no legal
14 recourse, and that, therefore, curative legislation is required to allow
15 them to file for office.

16 * Sec. 2. Any person who failed to enter the name of a political party
17 as defined by AS 15.60.010(6) on his declaration of candidacy has seven
18 days from the effective date of this Act to correct his declaration.

19 * Sec. 3. Any person who had a conflict of interest statement on file
20 with a municipality on June 1, 1978, and who did not file an additional
21 conflict of interest statement with the Alaska Public Offices Commission on
22 that date has seven days from the effective date of this Act to file a
23 conflict of interest statement with the Alaska Public Offices Commission.

24 * Sec. 4. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.-
25 10.070(c).
