5 Nominating the Fourth Avenue Federal
6 Office Building in Anchorage as an his-
7 toric site.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS the Fourth Avenue Federal Office Building in Anchorage, Alaska
10 began as a Public Works Administration project in 1939; and

11 WHEREAS since that time the building has played a substantial role in
12 the New Deal, Territorial and Statehood phases of Alaska's history and is an
13 outstanding example of the architecture of that era; and

14 WHEREAS this attractive, well-constructed building survived the 1964
15 earthquake undamaged and is considered by Alaskans to be an important struc-
16 ture and local landmark in the Anchorage central business district;

17 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature nominates the Fourth
18 Avenue Federal Office Building in Anchorage for inclusion in the National
19 Register of Historic Sites.

20 COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to the Honorable Cecil D. Andrus,
21 Secretary of the Interior; the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Mike
22 Gravel, U. S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U. S. Representative,
23 members of the Alaska delegation in Congress; and to Mr. Michael Carberry,
24 Executive Director of the Anchorage Historical Landmarks Preservation Com-
