6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to employees of publicly owned medical
7 clinics."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 23.40.200(b) is amended to read:

10 (b) The class in (a)(1) of this section is composed of police and
11 fire protection employees, jail, prison and other correctional insti-
12 tution employees, medical clinic employees, and hospital employees.
13 Employees in this class may not engage in strikes. Upon a showing by a
14 public employer or the labor relations agency that employees in this
15 class are engaging or about to engage in a strike, an injunction, re-
16 straining order, or other order which may be appropriate shall be
17 granted by the superior court in the judicial district in which the
18 strike is occurring or is about to occur. If an impasse or deadlock is
19 reached in collective bargaining between the public employer and em-
20 ployees in this class, and mediation has been utilized without resolving
21 the deadlock, the parties shall submit to arbitration to be carried out
22 under AS 09.43.030.
