6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to transportation of employees."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 23.10.380 is amended to read:

9 Sec. 23.10.380. RIGHT TO RETURN TRANSPORTATION. (a) An employer
10 who furnishes, pays for, or finances, agrees to furnish, pay for, or
11 finance, or in any other way provides transportation for a person from
12 the place of hire to a point inside or outside the state to employ him
13 shall furnish or pay for [PROVIDE] the person's [PERSON WITH] return
14 transportation to the place of hire from which transportation was fur-
15 nished, paid for, [OR] financed, or otherwise provided, or to a
16 destination agreed upon by the parties with transportation to be
17 furnished or paid for [FINANCED]

18 (1) on or after the termination of employment for a cause
19 considered good and sufficient by the department, beyond the control
20 of the person, or on or after the termination of the contract of
21 employment or a renewal of the contract; and

22 (2) upon the request of the person or the department made
23 within 45 days after the termination of employment.

24 (b) Upon the termination of employment, the subsistence of the
25 employee may not continue longer than 10 days after the termination or
26 until transportation is available, whichever occurs first.

27 (c) As used in this section,

28 (1) "return transportation" includes all transportation as
29 originally furnished, paid for, financed, or otherwise provided, and

1 subsistence of the employee while awaiting available transportation;
2 the term also includes transportation of members of the person's
3 family or household goods if that transportation was originally
4 furnished, paid for, financed, or otherwise provided by the employer,
5 unless the employer and the employee originally agreed otherwise in
6 writing at the time of hire;

7 (2) "subsistence" means board and lodging furnished by the
8 employer if the board and lodging are customarily furnished by the
9 employer or compensation to the employee at a rate equal to the appli-
10 cable "per diem" rate paid state employees for the area where the
11 employee was employed.
