ELEVENTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to motorist informational signs."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 19.25.105(a) is amended by adding a new paragraph to read:

(4) signs displaying the business name or logo of a public accommodation or service, for the convenience of motorists and to inform them of the availability of the accommodation or service, limited to gas, food, lodging, and camping, and erected in accordance with AS 19.25.107.

* Sec. 2. AS 19.25 is amended by adding a new section to read:

Sec. 19.25.107. MOTORIST INFORMATIONAL SIGNS. Motorist informational signs authorized under AS 19.25.105(a)(4) may be erected subject to the following conditions:

(1) a person desiring the department to erect a motorist informational sign shall apply on a form prescribed by the department; the application shall include the name and address of the applicant, the name, address, and nature of the business to which the sign will relate, the proposed location of the sign, and other information the department may request;

(2) upon approval of the application, the applicant shall pay a fee prescribed by the department to cover the cost of the sign and the cost of erecting and maintaining it;

(3) the department shall adopt the National Standards for Specific Information Signs prescribed by the Federal Highway Administra-

tion, and shall adopt regulations relating to the distance of motorist informational signs from eligible accommodations and services;

(4) a motorist informational sign relating to a public accommodation or service that is closed for more than 14 consecutive days shall be covered or removed by the department.

* Sec. 3. This Act terminates January 1, 1986.
