6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to motorist informational signs."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 19.25.105(a) is amended by adding a new paragraph to
9 read:

10 (4) signs displaying the business name or logo of a public
11 accommodation or service, for the convenience of motorists and to inform
12 them of the availability of the accommodation or service, limited to
13 gas, food, lodging, and camping, and erected in accordance with AS 19.-
14 25.107.

15 * Sec. 2. AS 19.25 is amended by adding a new section to read:

16 Sec. 19.25.107. MOTORIST INFORMATIONAL SIGNS. Motorist informa-
17 tional signs authorized under AS 19.25.105(a)(4) may be erected subject
18 to the following conditions:

19 (1) a person desiring the department to erect a motorist infor-
20 mational sign shall apply on a form prescribed by the department; the
21 application shall include the name and address of the applicant, the
22 name, address, and nature of the business to which the sign will relate,
23 the proposed location of the sign, and other information the department
24 may request;

25 (2) the applicant shall pay a fee based on a standard pub-
26 lished fee schedule prescribed by the department to cover the cost of
27 the sign and the cost of erecting and maintaining it;

28 (3) the department shall adopt the National Standards for
29 Specific Information Signs prescribed by the Federal Highway Administra-

1 tion, and shall adopt regulations relating to the distance of motorist
2 informational signs from eligible accommodations and services;

3 (4) a motorist informational sign relating to a public accommo-
4 dation or service that is closed for more than 14 consecutive days shall
5 be covered or removed by the department.

6 * Sec. 3. This Act terminates January 1, 1986.

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
