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IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

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ELEVENTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

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A BILL

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For an Act entitled: "An Act limiting the application of regulations

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relating to milk to that sold in the state and allowing

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the sale of unpasteurized milk."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

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* Section 1. AS 03.05.020(5)(A) is amended to read:

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(A) the labeling and grading of milk and milk products

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and standards of cleanliness and sanitation, to at least the mini-

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mum of current recommendations of the United States Public Health

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Service, for the operation of dairies selling, or offering for

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sale, milk or milk products sold in the state, except that unpa-

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teurized milk may be sold under regulations establishing a defini-

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tion and standards of identity and quality for unpasteurized milk;

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* Sec. 2. AS 03.17 is amended by adding a new section to read:

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Sec. 03.17.097. CERTIFICATION OF PRODUCERS OF UNPASTEURIZED MILK.

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(a) A dairy may not sell or offer for sale in the state unpasteurized

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milk or milk products unless the dairy is certified to sell unpasteurized

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milk or milk products by the division of agriculture.

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(b) The division of agriculture shall certify a dairy to offer to

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sell or to sell unpasteurized milk and milk products if the director

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finds that the producing milk stock of the dairy meets standards of the

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division relating to the absence of brucellosis and tuberculosis and

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that the milk and milk products of the dairy meet standards of the

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division relating to the absence of salmonella and to the maximum counts

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of sediment, leukocyte, and bacteria allowable.

1 (c) The producing milk stock of a dairy certified under this
2 section shall be tested every 60 days for brucellosis and tuberculosis.
3 The presence or absence of salmonella, and the sediment, leukocyte and
4 bacteria count of milk and milk products of a dairy certified under this
6 section must be ascertained every 30 days. If the producing milk stock
6 or milk and milk products of a dairy certified under this section fail
7 to meet the standards of the division of agriculture, the director shall
8 revoke the certification of the dairy.

9 (d) A dairy certified under this section shall affix over the
10 opening of each container containing unpasteurized milk or milk products
11 sold to consumers a sticker supplied by the division of agriculture
12 indicating that the product is raw milk, that raw milk is potentially
13 hazardous to children under two years of age, and that the tests re-
14 quired under this section have been administered to the producing stock
15 and the milk or milk product.

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
