A BILL

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For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to conflict of interest; and providing  
7 for an effective date."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

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\* Section 1. AS 39.50.020(a) is amended to read:

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(a) A judicial officer, commissioner, chairman or member of a  
state commission or board specified in AS 39.50.200(9), person hired or  
appointed as head or deputy head of, or director of a division within, a  
department in the executive branch, person appointed as assistant to the  
governor, and a municipal officer, shall file a statement giving his  
income sources and business interests, under oath and on penalty of  
perjury, within 30 days after he takes office as a public official.  
Candidates for state elective office shall file such a statement at the  
time of filing a declaration of candidacy or within 30 days of the  
filing of any nominating petition, or within 30 days of becoming a  
candidate by any other means. A candidate for state elective office who  
filed for the elective office during a year other than the year in which  
he seeks nomination or election to the office shall also file a statement  
required by this subsection on or before June 1 of the election year.  
Candidates for elective municipal office shall file such a statement at  
the time of filing a nominating petition, declaration of candidacy, or  
other required filing for the elective municipal office. Refusal or  
failure to file within the time prescribed shall require that the  
candidate's filing fees, if any, and filing for office be refused or  
that his previously accepted filing fee be returned and his name removed

1 from the filing records. A statement shall also be filed by public  
2 officials no later than April 15 [OR 15 DAYS AFTER THE PERSON FILES HIS  
3 FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURN] in each following year. A person who is  
4 subject to the reporting provisions of this chapter and who leaves that  
5 position shall file a statement covering the period from the date of the  
6 last previous statement that he filed in accordance with this subsection  
7 through the date of his termination from the position [ , WHICHEVER SHALL  
8 COME FIRST. PERSONS WHO, ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 11, 1974, WERE MEMBERS OF  
9 BOARDS OR COMMISSIONS NOT NAMED IN AS 39.50.200(9) ARE NOT REQUIRED TO  
10 FILE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS].

11 \* Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-  
12 070(c).

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
