7 Guide Board; terminating the Guide Licensing and Control
8 Board; relating to the use of state fish and game
9 resources by nonresidents and nonresident aliens; and
10 providing for an effective date."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

12 * Section 1. AS 16.05.255(a) is amended by adding a new paragraph to
13 read:

14 (11) establishment of the maximum number of nonresident aliens
15 allowed to take a species of game in all or part of a game management
16 unit.

Sec. 16.05.342. TROPHY TAGS. (a) A nonresident who takes an animal listed in AS 16.05.340(a)(21) shall obtain a nonresident big game trophy tag under AS 16.05.340(a)(21) before removing all or part of the animal from the state. A nonresident may authorize an agent in writing to obtain a nonresident big game trophy tag on his behalf.

(b) A nonresident big game trophy tag shall be a locking tag which shall be attached to the horns, antlers, skull or other appropriate part of the animal.

(c) The removal or attempted removal of an animal from the state in violation of (a) of this section is a misdemeanor.

Sec. 16.05.407. NONRESIDENT OR NONRESIDENT ALIEN HUNTING GAME ANIMALS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY GUIDES. (a) It is unlawful for a nonresident to hunt, pursue or take brown bear, grizzly bear, polar bear or sheep in this state, unless personally accompanied by a person who is licensed by the state as a master guide, registered guide or assistant guide or [BY THE DEPARTMENT, OR WHO IS PERSONALLY ACCOMPANIED] by a resident Alaskan over 19 years of age who is the spouse of or is related by blood within and including the second degree of kindred to the non-

1 resident. A person who applies for a nonresident big game tag for the
2 taking of an animal specified in this section shall first furnish to the
3 state, on a form provided by the state, a sworn statement [AN AFFIDAVIT]
4 showing that he will be accompanied in his hunt by a person who is
5 qualified under the terms of this section. A person who falsifies the
6 required sworn statement commits the crime [AFFIDAVIT IS GUILTY] of
7 perjury under AS 11.56.200.

8 (b) It is unlawful for a nonresident or a nonresident alien to
9 import polar bear into this state unless personally accompanied by a
10 person who is licensed by the state as a master guide, registered guide
11 or assistant guide [BY THE DEPARTMENT].

12 (c) A [THE] nonresident who violates (a) or (b) of this section
13 or a nonresident alien who violates (b) or (d) of this section is guilty
14 of a class A misdemeanor [AND UPON CONVICTION IS PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISON-
15 MENT FOR NOT MORE THAN ONE YEAR, OR BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$2,500,
16 OR BY BOTH].

17 (d) Except as provided in (e) of this section, it is unlawful
18 for a nonresident alien to trap, hunt, pursue or take game in this state
19 unless personally and continuously accompanied by a person who is li-
20 censed by the state as a master guide, registered guide, or assistant
21 guide, or by a person over 19 years of age who has been a resident of
22 the state for at least five years and who is familiar with the area in
23 which the trapping, hunting, pursuit, or taking of game is to occur. A
24 nonresident alien who applies for a hunting license or a big game tag
25 shall, when required by the Board of Game, furnish to the state, on a
26 form provided by the state, a sworn statement showing that he will be
27 accompanied in his hunt by a person who is qualified under this subsec-
28 tion. A person who falsifies the required sworn statement commits the
29 crime of perjury under AS 11.56.200.

1 (e) The Board of Game shall designate by regulation species of
2 small or unclassified game which a nonresident alien may hunt without
3 being personally accompanied by a person described in (d) of this
4 section.

7 Sec. 16.05.904. MARKING OF AIRCRAFT USED TO TRANSPORT HUNTERS.

8 (a) The Board of Game may adopt regulations in accordance with the
9 Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62) establishing identification
10 requirements for aircraft used by guides licensed under AS 16.50 for
11 transporting. The regulations may not apply to aircraft used by a
12 person other than a guide licensed under AS 16.50.

13 (b) In this section, "transporting" means conveying a person to an
14 area for remuneration or material benefit in excess of normal operating
15 costs, when the primary purpose of the person being conveyed is the
16 taking of big game and the associated removing of big game meat and
17 parts of big game after big game has been taken. "Big game" as used in
18 this subsection means game which, if taken by a nonresident, would

27 Sec. 16.50.011. CREATION AND MEMBERSHIP OF BOARD. There is created
28 in the division of fish and wildlife protection, Department of Public
29 Safety, the Guide Board consisting of six members. Three members of the

1 board shall be master guides or registered guides actively involved in
2 guiding. The other members shall have no interest in the guiding indus-
3 try, but shall have a general knowledge of the game resources of the
4 state. A minimum of 10 years residence in the state is required for all
5 members of the board.

6 Sec. 16.50.021. APPOINTMENT AND TERM OF OFFICE. The members of
7 the board shall be appointed by the governor and confirmed by the legis-
8 lature for staggered terms of three years or until their successors are
9 appointed. A member may be removed at the pleasure of the governor. A
10 person may not be appointed to the board for more than two consecutive
11 terms.

17 Sec. 16.50.041. DUTIES OF BOARD. (a) Except as provided in
18 AS 16.50.051, the board shall

- 19 (1) prepare, grade and administer examinations;
- 20 (2) determine and pass on qualifications of applicants for
21 licenses and authorize the issuance of licenses to those who qualify;
- 22 (3) establish guide performance standards and regulate activ-
23 ity;
- 24 (4) compile, maintain and publish a guide register of guides
25 who have not been convicted of a violation of a federal or state sport
26 fish, game, or guiding statute or regulation; a guide listed in the
27 register whose license is revoked or suspended shall be removed from the
28 register while his license is revoked or suspended;
- 29 (5) compile, maintain, and publish a record of registered or

1 master guides who have completed a contract hunt in any of three years
2 immediately preceding the publishing of the record;

3 (6) prohibit guiding activities which are unsportmanlike,
4 unethical, unsafe, against principles of conservation, or which adversely
5 affect the natural resources;

6 (7) after a hearing, revoke, suspend or deny renewal of a
7 license in accordance with AS 16.50.201;

8 (8) establish a quota of licensed operating guides who may
9 operate within designated geographical game units or subunits of the
10 state and provide for an equitable and reasonable procedure for limiting
11 the number of guides to that quota; preference shall be given to quali-
12 fied available and willing licensed guides who reside within the desig-
13 nated game unit or subunit.

14 (b) If a person is unable to understand the written portion of an
15 examination given under (a)(1) of this section, he shall be given the
16 complete examination orally in a language which he understands.

17 Sec. 16.50.051. SPECIAL GUIDING PERMIT. This chapter does not
18 limit the power of the board or its authorized designee to issue a
19 special guiding permit, in place of a guide license, to a person to
20 guide in a designated area, if the person is considered sufficiently
21 experienced to perform the services of a guide and is limited solely by
22 language barriers from securing a regular guide license.

23 Sec. 16.50.061. BOARD REGULATIONS. The board shall adopt regu-
24 lations under the Administrative Procedure Act (AS 44.62) to implement
25 this chapter.

26 Sec. 16.50.071. BOARD HEARING. The Administrative Procedure Act
27 (AS 44.62) applies to proceedings and hearings under this chapter.

28 Sec. 16.50.081. COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES. Members of the board
29 receive no salary, but are entitled to per diem and travel expenses

1 authorized by law for boards and commissions.

2 ARTICLE 2. LICENSING.

3 Sec. 16.50.091. QUALIFICATIONS FOR A MASTER GUIDE LICENSE. A
4 person is entitled to be licensed as a master guide if he

5 (1) has legally hunted in the state for a part of each of 10
6 years during which time a substantial source of his income was from
7 guiding or related activities directly contributing to his experience
8 and competency as a guide;

9 (2) meets all the requirements of a registered guide and has
10 been actively engaged in licensed guiding activities in the state for at
11 least five years preceding application;

12 (3) has not been convicted of a violation of federal or state
13 sport fishing, game, or guiding laws or regulations within the preceding
14 five years; and

15 (4) has consistently performed in a superior manner as evi-
16 denced by required reports submitted to the board and by inquiries made
17 by the board to at least two of the guide's clients of record.

18 Sec. 16.50.101. QUALIFICATIONS FOR REGISTERED GUIDE LICENSE. A
19 person is entitled to be licensed as a registered guide if he

20 (1) is 21 years of age or more;

21 (2) is a resident of the state and maintains a permanent
22 place of abode in the state;

23 (3) has practical field experience in the handling of fire-
24 arms, hunting, judging trophies, field preparation of trophies, first
25 aid, and photography;

26 (4) is familiar with the terrain and transportation problems
27 in the district for which the license is requested;

28 (5) has passed the qualification examination prepared and
29 administered by the board;

1 (6) has demonstrated to the board sufficient standards of
2 competence and ethical conduct and has not been convicted of a crime
3 involving moral turpitude;

4 (7) has legally hunted in the state for all or part of each
5 of five years in a manner directly contributing to his experience and
6 competency as a guide;

7 (8) has been licensed as and performed the services of an
8 assistant guide in the state for a part of each of three years;

9 (9) submits a written recommendation to the board from a
10 registered guide for whom the applicant has worked;

11 (10) is capable of performing the physical duties associated
12 with guiding activities;

13 (11) has been favorably recommended in writing by two hunters
14 that he has guided or assisted in guiding during each year of his three
15 years as an assistant guide, whose recommendations have been solicited by
16 the board from a list provided by the applicant;

17 (12) meets additional qualifications which the board may
18 require.

19 Sec. 16.50.111. QUALIFICATIONS FOR CLASS-A ASSISTANT GUIDE LICENSE.

20 (a) A person is entitled to be licensed as a class-A assistant guide if
21 he

22 (1) has been employed for at least one season as a licensed
23 assistant guide;

24 (2) has had at least 20 years experience in the game manage-
25 ment unit in which he is to be employed;

26 (3) has been recommended in writing as qualified by a regis-
27 tered or master guide to the board.

28 (b) In (a)(2) of this section, physical presence at some time of
29 the year during each of the 20 years constitutes adequate evidence of

1 experience, and military service outside the state for no more than six
2 years shall be accepted by the board as part of the required 20 years of
3 experience.

4 Sec. 16.50.121. PRIVILEGES AND LIMITATIONS OF CLASS-A ASSISTANT
5 GUIDES. A class-A assistant guide

6 (1) may not contract for hunts;

7 (2) shall be under the supervision of a registered or master
8 guide who has contracted with the client for whom the class-A assistant
9 guide is conducting the hunt;

10 (3) may take charge of a camp and conduct hunts from it
11 without the registered or master guide being present in the area if the
12 registered or master guide is physically present in the state and is
13 actively supervising in guiding activities.

14 Sec. 16.50.131. QUALIFICATIONS FOR ASSISTANT GUIDE LICENSE. A
15 person is entitled to be licensed as an assistant guide if he

16 (1) is 19 years of age or more;

17 (2) is a resident of the state;

18 (3) is favorably recommended to the board, in writing, by a
19 registered guide;

20 (4) meets additional qualifications which the board may
21 require;

22 (5) is in sound physical condition.

23 Sec. 16.50.141. RESPONSIBILITY OF REGISTERED OR MASTER GUIDE FOR
24 VIOLATIONS. A registered or master guide contracting for a hunt is
25 equally responsible under AS 16.50.201 for a violation of a federal or
26 state sport fish, game, or guiding statute or regulation committed by a
27 class-A assistant guide or assistant guide while in the course of his
28 employment.

29 Sec. 16.50.151. LICENSE FEES. (a) License fees for engaging in

1 the profession of guiding are:

- 2 (1) master guide license, annual \$75
- 3 (2) registered guide license, annual.....\$75
- 4 (3) class-A assistant guide, annual..... \$15
- 5 (4) assistant guide license, annual..... \$10

6 (b) The license fee for a master guide, registered guide, class-A
7 assistant guide, or assistant guide license is in addition to the fee
8 required for a hunting or fishing license.

9 Sec. 16.50.161. EXAMINATION FEE. An applicant for a guide examina-
10 tion shall pay a fee of \$25.

11 Sec. 16.50.181. EXAMINATION. The qualification examination re-
12 quired to be passed by persons seeking a license under AS 16.50.091 and
13 16.50.101 shall be administered twice a year in both Juneau and
14 Anchorage.

15 Sec. 16.50.191. EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL. (a) A master guide,
16 registered guide, class-A assistant guide, or assistant guide license
17 expires on December 31 of the calendar year following the calendar year
18 in which the license was issued.

19 (b) A license may not be issued to a class-A assistant guide or
20 assistant guide who has failed to renew his license for two consecutive
21 years unless he again meets the qualifications for initial issuance of
22 the license.

23 (c) If a master guide fails to renew his license, he is not re-
24 quired to requalify under AS 16.50.091(2) if he applies for another
25 license under AS 16.50.091. If a registered guide fails to renew his
26 license, he is not required to requalify under AS 16.50.101(8) if he
27 applies for another license under AS 16.50.101.

28 ARTICLE 3. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

29 Sec. 16.50.201. GROUNDS FOR DISCIPLINING A LICENSEE. (a) The

1 board shall hold a hearing to determine if disciplinary action is neces-
2 sary if within the last five years

3 (1) complaints concerning the licensee have been filed with
4 the board from three or more clients from separate parties; or

5 (2) a licensee has been convicted of a violation of a federal
6 or state sport fish, game, or guiding statute or regulation.

7 (b) After a hearing, the board may revoke, suspend, or deny renewal
8 of a license if the board finds that the licensee

9 (1) engaged in unethical activity, unsafe activity, or activ-
10 ity which adversely affects the natural resources of the state and the
11 activity is unrelated to the legal and legitimate purposes of the con-
12 tract hunt; or

13 (2) violated a provision of a federal or state sport fish,
14 game, or guiding statute or regulation.

15 (c) After a hearing, the board shall revoke, suspend, or deny re-
16 newal of a license if the board finds that the licensee

17 (1) does not meet the qualifications specified by statute or
18 regulation for the class of license held;

19 (2) is incompetent as a master guide, registered guide,
20 class-A assistant guide, or assistant guide;

21 (3) within the last five years has been convicted of two
22 violations of federal or state sport fish, game or guiding statutes or
23 regulations.

24 (d) A person who is disciplined under this section may not engage
25 in any guiding activity during the period of license revocation or
26 disciplinary action. A person licensed under this chapter may not hire
27 or work for a guide whose license is suspended or revoked under this
28 section.

29 (e) If the board revokes a license it shall notify the Department

1 of Revenue, and the person whose license has been revoked shall return
2 the license to the Department of Public Safety.

3 Sec. 16.50.211. UNLAWFUL ACTS. (a) It is unlawful for

4 (1) a master guide, registered guide, class-A assistant
5 guide, or assistant guide to fail to report to the Department of Public
6 Safety, division of fish and wildlife protection, a violation by a
7 client of a state fish, game, or guiding statute or regulation within 30
8 days of the violation;

9 (2) a master guide, registered guide, class A assistant
10 guide, or assistant guide to aid the commission of a violation of this
11 chapter or of AS 16.05 or a regulation adopted under either chapter, or
12 permit the commission of a violation in his sight without attempting to
13 prevent it, short of using force, and without reporting it;

14 (3) a person to guide, as defined in this chapter, without
15 being licensed under this chapter and without having the license in his
16 actual possession;

17 (4) a person to advertise as or represent himself to be a
18 licensed master guide, registered guide, class-A assistant guide, or
19 assistant guide without being currently licensed, or to falsely adver-
20 tise services;

21 (5) a person to guide, as defined in this chapter, without
22 having a current valid hunting and fishing license in his possession;

23 (6) a master or registered guide to employ or have under his
24 supervision more than three assistant guides at the same time.

25 (b) A person who violates (a) of this section is guilty of a
26 misdemeanor and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of not more than
27 \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or by both, and
28 may have his license revoked for a period up to five years. However, a
29 person who engages in guiding activity during the period his license is

1 suspended or revoked under this chapter is guilty of a felony punishable,
2 upon conviction, by a fine of not more than \$5,000 and by imprisonment
3 for not less than one year nor more than three years. In addition to
4 punishment for a felony, all guns, fishing tackle, boats, aircraft,
5 automobiles or other vehicles, camping gear and other equipment and
6 paraphernalia used in, or in aid of, guiding or transporting activity
7 engaged in during the period of suspension or revocation shall be con-
8 fiscated by persons authorized to enforce this chapter.

9 Sec. 16.50.221. INJUNCTION AGAINST UNLAWFUL ACTION. If, in the
10 opinion of the board, a person or corporation or other entity has en-
11 gaged in an act in violation of AS 16.50.121, 16.50.201 - 16.50.211, or
12 the regulations adopted under them, the board may apply to the court for
13 an order enjoining the act. Upon a showing by the board that the person
14 is engaging in the act, the court shall grant injunctive relief or other
15 appropriate order without bond.

16 ARTICLE 4. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

17 Sec. 16.50.411. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter,

- 18 (1) "board" means the Guide Board;
- 19 (2) "guide" or "guiding" means assisting another person to
20 take game with the intent of receiving monetary or material remuneration
21 for the services, by accompanying and directing that person personally
22 or through a licensed assistant for the duration of a hunt, and not
23 solely for the purpose of providing transportation services;
- 24 (3) "resident" means a person who maintains a permanent place
25 of residence in the state, has not claimed residency in another state
26 for the immediately preceding 12 months, and shows by all attending
27 circumstances that his intent is to make this state his permanent resi-
28 dence;
- 29 (4) "unethical activity" means

1 (A) deception in any degree involving prospective or
2 actual clients either before, during, or following contract hunts;

3 (B) misrepresentation either through private communica-
4 tion or public advertising of the nature, type, duration, cost, or
5 other conditions of contract hunts;

6 (C) making a guaranty that a species or certain number
7 of species of game will be taken on a contract hunt.

18 * Sec. 12. REEVALUATION OF LICENSING AND GUIDING AREA PERMITS. (a)
19 Within one year of the effective date of this Act, the Guide Board shall, for
20 each game management unit, reevaluate the practices, procedures, and regula-
21 tions of the former Guide Licensing and Control Board (AS 08.54) with respect
22 to guide, and assistant guide licensing and with respect to guiding area
23 permits, and shall amend any practice, procedure or regulation which it
24 determines

25 (1) poses an unwarranted barrier to the obtaining of a permit or
26 license by an Alaska Native or other rural resident;

27 (2) gives inadequate consideration to the need for localized
28 expertise with respect to unique ice, terrain, weather, sea or other local
29 conditions;

1 (3) inadequately recognizes the role of guiding in the local
2 culture and economy; or

3 (4) conflicts with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure
4 Act (AS 44.62).

5 (b) In conducting the reevaluation under (a) of this section, the Guide
6 Board shall solicit comments and recommendations from interested parties,
7 including local fish and game advisory committees.

8 (c) On or before the 10th day of the First Session of the Twelfth
9 Legislature, the Guide Board shall transmit to the presiding officer of each
10 house of the legislature a report on any amendments in practices, procedures,
11 or regulations made or pending under (a) of this section. If any recommenda-
12 tion of a local fish and game advisory committee notified under (b) of this
13 section is not accepted by the Guide Board, the reasons for the rejection
14 shall be specifically stated by the Guide Board in its report.

15 (d) One year after the effective date of this Act, the Guide Board
16 shall begin, and, within two years of the effective date of this Act, shall
17 complete a reevaluation of each decision rendered by the former Guide
18 Licensing and Control Board (AS 08.54) with respect to the granting, denial,
19 or conditioning of a guiding area permit for each game management unit for
20 which reevaluation is made under (a) of this section. The reevaluation shall
21 be made under the former Guide Licensing and Control Board's practices,
22 procedures, and regulations as amended under (a) of this section. As a
23 result of the reevaluation under this subsection, the Guide Board may

24 (1) grant additional guiding area permits for an area, consistent
25 with sound conservation practice;

26 (2) alter the boundaries of guiding areas or the terms or condi-
27 tions of previously issued guiding area permits; or

28 (3) to the extent necessary to effectuate the amendments made
29 under (a) of this section, and if no feasible alternative exists consistent

1 with sound conservation practice, revoke existing guiding area permits.

2 (e) The board may not amend or revoke an existing guiding area permit
3 under (d) of this section until the permit holder is accorded the opportunity
4 for an adjudicatory hearing.

5 (f) In providing for the reevaluation of game management units under
6 (a) of this section, the Guide Board shall first reevaluate those game manage-
7 ment units which it has substantial reason to believe were administered by
8 the former Guide Licensing and Control Board (AS 08.54) in a manner which

9 (1) involved discrimination, intentional or de facto, against
10 Alaska Natives or other rural residents;

11 (2) failed to allocate guiding area permits with due regard for
12 the need for local expertise as described in (a)(2) of this section;

13 (3) disregarded local cultural or economic needs; or

14 (4) failed to comply with the provisions of the Administrative
15 Procedure Act (AS 44.62).

16 (g) The legislature finds and declares that Game Management Unit 23 has
17 been subject to the conditions described in (f) of this section, and a re-
18 evaluation under (a) of this section shall be undertaken for that game manage-
19 ment unit. All guiding area permits issued are revoked for Game Management
20 Unit 23. The Guide Board may begin reissuance of guiding area permits for
21 that unit after evaluation of the unit under (a) of this section. Until the
22 beginning of reissuance under this subsection, a guiding area permit is
23 required to guide within Game Management Unit 23.

24 (h) In amending its practices, procedures, and regulations under (a) of
25 this section, the Guide Board may vary its practice, procedure, and regula-
26 tions on a game management unit basis.
