HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3 am
IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA
ELEVENTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

Relating to enforcement of the Anti-
quities Act.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the act of the President of the United States in invoking the Antiquities Act to close some 56,000,000 acres of Alaska's land to general public use was arbitrary and beyond the intent of the law, and

WHEREAS it would be inappropriate for the State of Alaska to participate in this arbitrary act, and

WHEREAS this arbitrary act could not be foreseen at the time the legislature approved the budget for fiscal year 1979;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the governor is respectfully requested to direct all employees of the Executive Branch that no state personnel, time, facilities or funds are to be used to enforce, or to assist the Federal Government in enforcing, the Antiquities Act or the federal regulations which implement it; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that nothing in this resolution concerns in any way the continued enforcement of state law.
