4 ELEVENTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Requesting the Economic Development
6 Administration to support the in-
7 terests of the City of Saxman in the
8 Ketchikan and Northern Terminal.

9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 WHEREAS the Ketchikan and Northern Terminal was originally developed by
11 the United States government as an area redevelopment project for the City of
12 Saxman through the Area Redevelopment Administration which was the predeces-
13 sor of the Economic Development Administration; and

14 WHEREAS the City of Saxman owns the Ketchikan and Northern Terminal but
15 has had no active role in its operations since July 20, 1965; and

16 WHEREAS the Economic Development Administration, through its receiver,
17 has controlled the operations of the terminal since July 20, 1965; and

18 WHEREAS any activity by the Economic Development Administration or its
19 receiver having an effect on the future of the Ketchikan and Northern Ter-
20 minal will have an economic and social impact on the City of Saxman;

21 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature requests the Economic
22 Development Administration to exercise every effort to insure that the orig-
23 inal intent behind establishing the Ketchikan and Northern Terminal as an
24 area redevelopment project aimed at benefiting the City of Saxman be carried
25 out in order to protect the City of Saxman from any adverse economic and
26 social impact and to protect the city's rights of ownership in the Ketchikan
27 and Northern Terminal.

29 Assistant Secretary for Economic Development, Department of Commerce; and to

1 the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Mike Gravel, U.S. Senators, and
2 the Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska delega-
3 tion in Congress.

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
