5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the longevity bonus program; and
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 47.45.030 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 47.45.030. ABSENCE FROM THE STATE. A recipient shall notify
11 the commissioner of administration when he expects to be absent from
12 the state if the absence is for a continuous period that exceeds 30
13 days. After that notification, the recipient shall no longer receive
14 bonuses from the Department of Administration after his last regularly
15 approved monthly application. Upon his return to the state he may
16 again make application for a bonus. [WHENEVER THE ABSENCE IS FOR A
17 CONTINUOUS PERIOD THAT EXCEEDS 180 DAYS THE RECIPIENT SHALL BE DIS-
18 QUALIFIED FROM RECEIVING BONUSES FOR THE NEXT 12 CALENDAR MONTHS AFTER
19 HIS RETURN TO THE STATE. HOWEVER, WHEN THE COMMISSIONER OF ADMINISTRA-
20 TION DETERMINES A PERIOD OF ABSENCE IS BEYOND THE CONTROL OF THE RECIP-
21 IENT, HE MAY NOT BE DISQUALIFIED, IF HE STILL OTHERWISE QUALIFIES UPON
22 HIS RETURN TO THE STATE.] Continual absences from the state, even
23 though reported, and failure to notify the commissioner of an expected
24 absence may be grounds for disqualification.

25 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect July 1, 1981.
