5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to expenditure of state money; and
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 44.06.196 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 44.06.196. CAPITAL RELOCATION EXPENDITURES. State money may
11 be expended to relocate physically the present functions of the state
12 government, including but not limited to, the legislature, the gover-
13 nor's office and all offices of the heads of the principal departments
14 from their present location only after a majority of those voting in a
15 statewide election have approved a bond issue which includes all bonded
16 [BONDABLE] costs of the relocation to the state through the year 1986
17 [1992], as determined by a commission created by the legislature to
18 plan the relocation or to develop the new capital city. In determining
19 the bonded [BONDABLE] costs to the state the commission shall also
20 determine the total costs to the state. Those costs shall include, but
21 not be limited to, the costs of moving personnel and offices to the
22 relocation site; the social, economic and environmental costs to the
23 present and relocation sites; and, the cost to the state of planning,
24 building, furnishing, using and financing a new capital city [HAVING
25 FACILITIES EQUAL TO THOSE PROVIDED BY THE PRESENT CAPITAL CITY AND
26 THOSE REQUIRED BY THE 1974 CAPITAL MOVE INITIATIVE].

27 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
