5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act amending provisions of law relating to the New
7 Capital Site Planning Commission; and providing for an
8 effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 44.06.210(a) is amended to read:

11 (a) The [WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ACT,
12 THE] governor shall appoint a commission consisting of nine members [,
13 SUBJECT TO CONFIRMATION BY A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE
14 IN JOINT SESSION]. Members are appointed for five-year [FOUR-YEAR]
15 terms and may be reappointed. Members shall be appointed on a nonparti-
16 san basis, and shall be selected as follows:

- 17 (1) one member must be a registered engineer;
18 (2) one member with a financial or economic background;
19 (3) the mayor of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough or his desig-
20 nee;
21 (4) the mayor of the city and borough of Juneau or his
22 designee; and
23 (5) five members appointed from the general public.

24 * Sec. 2. AS 44.06.220 is amended to read:

25 Sec. 44.06.220. MEETING OF THE COMMISSION. The members shall
26 elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among their membership. [THE
27 GOVERNOR SHALL CALL THE FIRST MEETING OF THE COMMISSION WITHIN 15 DAYS
28 AFTER APPOINTMENT OF THE MEMBERS.] A majority of the members consti-
29 tutes a quorum for conducting business and exercising the powers of the

1 commission. The commission shall meet at the call of the chairman, at
2 the request of a majority of the members, or at a regularly scheduled
3 time as determined by the members.

4 * Sec. 3. AS 44.06.230(a) is amended to read:

5 (a) The purpose of the commission is to prepare a detailed plan
6 for development of the capital site within the guidelines enumerated in
7 this chapter. This detailed development plan shall be completed no
8 later than January 20, 1982, [MARCH 15, 1978] and shall be made subject
9 to public comment [INPUT] during its formulation. Following completion
10 of the plan, the commission shall make public presentations of it
11 throughout the state.

12 * Sec. 4. AS 44.06.230(e) is amended to read:

13 (e) The commission shall, no later than January 20, 1982
14 [MARCH 15, 1978], recommend to the legislature the type of development
15 entity which would be responsible for capital city development as well
16 as the powers and authority which should be vested in this development
17 entity.

18 * Sec. 5. AS 44.06.230(f) is amended to read:

19 (f) The commission shall conduct a cost analysis which includes
20 proposed construction schedules and related cost studies including but
21 not limited to construction costs and escalation, energy efficient
22 construction, and life cycle costing including operations and mainte-
23 nance costs. The commission shall also prepare financing analysis
24 including the investigation of funding alternatives and submission of a
25 recommended financial plan to the legislature no later than January 20,
26 1982 [FEBRUARY 1, 1978].

27 * Sec. 6. AS 44.06.230(j) is amended to read:

28 (j) In this section, "detailed plan for development of capital
29 site" means the development of those facilities, public and private,

1 described in the report entitled "State Capital Relocation: Alternate
2 Plan and Estimate of Cost," dated September, 1979 [CAPITAL SITE SELEC-
3 TION COMMITTEE REPORT DATED DECEMBER 11, 1975]. The initial and overall
4 site specific development plan shall be presented to the legislature no
5 later than January 20, 1982 [MARCH 15, 1978].

6 * Sec. 7. APPOINTMENTS TO VACANCIES. Within 15 days of the enactment of
7 this Act, the governor shall appoint members to fill vacancies in the member-
8 ship of the New Capital Site Planning Commission on the effective date of
9 this Act.

10 * Sec. 8. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
11 070(c).
