A BILL

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For an Act entitled: "An Act providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds in the amount of \$102,027,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of water, sewer, and solid waste facilities construction; and providing for an effective date."

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11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

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* Section 1. For the purpose of paying the cost of water, sewer, and solid waste facilities construction, general obligation bonds of the state in the principal amount of not more than \$102,027,000 shall be issued and sold. None of these bonds may be issued or sold until February 15, 1983. The full faith, credit, and resources of the state are pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on these bonds. These bonds shall be issued under the provisions of AS 37.15 as those provisions read at the time of issuance.

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* Sec. 2. If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the qualified voters of the state, a special fund of the state to be known as the "1982 Water, Sewer, and Solid Waste Facilities Construction Fund" shall be established, to which shall be credited the proceeds of the sale of the bonds described in sec. 1 of this Act except for the accrued interest and premiums.

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* Sec. 3. The amount of \$3,484,000 is appropriated from the "1982 Water, Sewer, and Solid Waste Facilities Construction Fund" to the Department of Environmental Conservation for the following water and sewer and solid waste facilities projects in the following communities:

18 * Sec. 6. The amount of \$15,000,000 is appropriated from the "1982 Water,
19 Sewer, and Solid Waste Facilities Construction Fund" to the Department of
20 Environmental Conservation for grants to municipalities for water supply,
21 sewerage, and solid waste facilities projects in accordance with AS 46.03.030.

22 * Sec. 7. If a municipality does not spend an appropriation under sec. 4
23 of this Act within two years of receipt, the unexpended balance of that
24 appropriation is reappropriated to the Department of Environmental Conserva-
25 tion for grants to municipalities for water supply, sewerage, and solid waste
26 facilities projects in accordance with AS 46.03.030.

27 * Sec. 8. The appropriations for projects made in this Act may be reap-
28 propriated among the projects by law.

29 * Sec. 9. If the issuance of these bonds is authorized by the qualified

1 voters of the state, the amount of \$357,100 or as much of that amount as is
2 found necessary is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the
3 state bond committee to carry out the provisions of this Act and to pay
4 expenses incident to the sale and issuance of the bonds authorized in this
5 Act. The amounts expended from the appropriation authorized by this section
6 shall be reimbursed to the general fund from the proceeds of the sale of the
7 bonds authorized by this Act.

8 * Sec. 10. The amount withdrawn from the public facility planning fund
9 for the purpose of advance planning for the improvements financed under this
10 Act shall be reimbursed to the fund from the proceeds of the sale of bonds
11 authorized by this Act.

12 * Sec. 11. The question whether the bonds authorized in this Act are to
13 be issued shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the state at the next
14 general election and shall read substantially as follows:

15 Proposition

16 State General Obligation Water, Sewer, and Solid
17 Waste Facilities Construction Bonds \$102,027,000

18 Shall the State of Alaska issue its general obligation bonds
19 in the principal amount of not more than \$102,027,000 for the
20 purpose of paying the cost of the water, sewer, and solid waste
21 facilities construction?
