6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to motor vehicles and carriers; and
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 42.10 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10 Sec. 42.10.095. TRANSPORTATION SUBCONTRACTORS. (a) The commission
11 shall supervise and regulate transportation subcontractors in the state
12 and shall prescribe regulations consistent with this chapter concerning
13 the filing of reports by transportation subcontractors, the issuance of
14 nontransferable annual permits to transportation subcontractors based on
15 public convenience and necessity, and the maximum and minimum rates that
16 may be charged by transportation subcontractors.

17 (b) A permit issued under this section shall authorize the specific
18 number and the types of vehicles to be operated by the transportation
19 subcontractor.

20 (c) A permit issued under this section may not be transferred and
21 does not transfer with a sale, lease, or other transfer of a vehicle.
22 If a person who holds a permit dies or fails to use a permit for two
23 years, the permit shall revert to the state.

24 (d) A transportation subcontractor may replace vehicles authorized
25 under a permit but may not increase the number of vehicles authorized
26 under the permit.

27 (e) In this section "transportation subcontractor" means a person
28 who rents, leases, or otherwise provides a motor vehicle for the use of
29 common or contract carriers in transporting property and who provides or

1 arranges for, directly or indirectly, a driver or operator for the
2 vehicle but does not include taxicabs.

3 (f) A person who conducted business as a transportation subcontrac-
4 tor in the state at any time between July 1, 1976, and the effective
5 date of this Act and who applies to the commission within one year after
6 the effective date of this Act shall be issued an annual permit under
7 this section.

8 (g) At least annually the commission shall determine the number of
9 permits available to be issued based on public convenience and necessity.
10 If permits are available, the commission shall issue additional permits
11 to applicants who are fit, willing, and able in the order in which they
12 have applied until the available number of permits have been issued.

13 * Sec. 2. The Alaska Transportation Commission shall adopt regulations as
14 provided in AS 42.10.095 enacted in sec. 1 of this Act within 90 days after
15 the effective date of this Act.

16 * Sec. 3. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.-
17 10.070(c).
