6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to retroactive contributions to the
7 public employees' retirement system; and providing for
8 an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 39.35.125(b) is amended to read:

11 (b) Service as an elected official before January 1, 1981, with
12 an employer may be included retroactively as credited service with the
13 system if the elected official or former elected official makes retro-
14 active contributions equal to what he would have made if he had been
15 included in the system when he took the oath of his office as an elected
16 official. However, if the elected or former elected official was
17 employed by or elected to office in a municipality his retroactive
18 contributions shall be computed on the basis of the compensation as
19 compensation was defined by ordinance of the municipality during his
20 period of service, including, if the ordinance allows, per diem and
21 expense allowances paid by the municipality. For all other elected
22 officials and former elected officials the [THE] rate used to calculate
23 the retroactive contributions may not be less than the rate in effect
24 on January 1, 1961. An elected official or former elected official
25 must claim prior service and make retroactive contributions before Feb-
26 ruary 1, 1982. An elected official or former elected official may not
27 receive credited service under this subsection for any period in which
28 he was receiving a retirement benefit from the system. An elected
29 official or former elected official receiving a retirement benefit from

1 the system on January 1, 1981, is not eligible to claim credited service
2 under this subsection unless he is reemployed as an active member and
3 claims the credited service before February 1, 1982. Service as an
4 elected official with an employer constitutes employment as an active
5 member so long as no waiver of coverage under (a) of this section is
6 in effect.

7 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
