6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the prevention and treatment of
7 drug abuse."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 *Section 1. PURPOSE. It is the purpose of the legislature in this Act
10 to assist local communities in planning, organizing, and financing drug
11 abuse prevention and treatment services through locally developed and admin-
12 istered drug abuse prevention and treatment programs.

13 * Sec. 2. AS 47.37.040 is amended by adding new paragraphs to read:

14 (20) develop a state plan for drug abuse based on locally
15 determined needs;

16 (21) provide drug abuse prevention and treatment services by
17 means of grants to and contracts with drug abuse programs that are
18 locally developed and administered;

19 (22) complete fiscal audits and contract compliance evalua-
20 tions of local drug abuse prevention and treatment programs on a yearly
21 basis;

22 (23) provide the legislature with an annual summary report of
23 the program audits and evaluations completed under (22) of this section;

24 (24) establish a fiscal year budget which includes the money
25 referred to in AS 47.37.045 for grants to and contracts with drug abuse
26 programs that are locally developed and administered.

27 * Sec. 3. AS 47.37 is amended by adding a new section to read:

28 Sec. 47.37.045. ALLOCATION OF MONEY RECEIVED FOR DRUG ABUSE
29 PREVENTION AND TREATMENT PROGRAMS. Administrative costs for the opera-

tion of the office may not exceed 10 percent of the total amount of state and federal money received for those programs. The balance of state and federal money received by the office for drug abuse prevention and treatment programs shall be expended for grants to and contracts with the drug abuse programs that are locally developed and administered.
