6 For an Act entitled: An Act relating to licensing of certain chiropractors
7 without examination; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 08.20.140 is repealed and reenacted to read:

11 Sec. 08.20.140. LICENSURE BY CREDENTIALS. The board may provide
12 for the licensing without examination of a chiropractor who

13 (1) is a graduate of a legally chartered accredited school or
14 college of chiropractic, approved by the board, that requires for
15 graduation a residence course of instruction of not less than four years
16 of nine months each;

17 (2) is licensed to practice chiropractic in another state,
18 territory, or region with licensing requirements at the time of licen-
19 sure in the other jurisdiction that the board finds to be the equivalent
20 of the licensing requirements of this state at the time of application
21 for a license without examination;

22 (3) has been engaged in the active practice of chiropractic
23 for the three years immediately preceding the application;

24 (4) is not the subject of an unresolved complaint, review
25 procedure, or disciplinary proceeding undertaken by a professional
26 chiropractic association;

27 (5) has not previously had a license to practice chiropractic
28 revoked;

29 (6) has not failed the practical examination authorized by

1 AS 08.20.130;

2 (7) is personally interviewed by the board;

3 (8) pays all fees required under AS 08.20.180.

4 * Sec. 2. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.10.-
5 070(c).
