5 A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act making special and supplemental appropriations;
7 extending lapse dates; repealing certain appropriations;
8 and providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. The sum of \$150,000 is appropriated from the general fund to
11 the Department of Commerce and Economic Development, office of mineral devel-
12 opment, for the production of a documentary film on Alaska's mining history
13 and potential.

14 * Sec. 2. The sum of \$26,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the
15 Office of the Governor for the Alaska games unit for participation of Alaska
16 athletes in the Arctic Winter Games during the fiscal year ending June 30,
17 1982.

18 * Sec. 3. The sum of \$547,600 is appropriated from the general fund to
19 the Department of Revenue for municipal assistance under AS 43.20.016 for the
20 fiscal year ending June 30, 1982.

21 * Sec. 4. The sum of \$97,200 is appropriated from the general fund to the
22 Office of the Governor, State Commission for Human Rights, for a shortfall in
23 personal services money for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982.

24 * Sec. 5. The sum of \$479,173 is appropriated from the general fund to
25 the Department of Community and Regional Affairs for payments to the follow-
26 ing municipalities in the following amounts for the purposes set out in
27 AS 29.88 - AS 29.95:

 19 payment as a grant to the City of Petersburg for construction of a hospital.

 21 payment as a grant to the Kenai Peninsula Borough for the South Hospital
 22 Service Area for hospital construction.

 16 budget summary by funding source to the state agencies named and for the
 17 purposes set out in the new legislation for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
 18 1982 and ending June 30, 1983. The appropriation items contain funding for
 19 legislation assumed to have passed during the Second Session of the Twelfth
 20 Legislature and are to be considered part of the agency operating budget.
 21 Should a measure listed in this section either fail to pass, its substance
 22 fail to be incorporated in some other measure, or be vetoed by the governor,
 23 the appropriation for that measure shall lapse.

19 * Sec. 27. The appropriation made by secs. 7 and 8 of this Act shall be
20 disbursed in accordance with AS 37.05.315.

21 * Sec. 28. The appropriations made in secs. 12, 13, and 17 of this Act
22 are for capital projects and are subject to AS 37.25.020.

23 * Sec. 29. Section 21 of this Act takes effect July 1, 1982.

24 * Sec. 30. Except for section 21, this Act takes effect immediately in
25 accordance with AS 01.10.070(c).
