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SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 51

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IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

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TWELFTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

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Relating to establishment of a Commit-

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tee on Employment and Productivity as

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part of the University of Alaska.

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

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WHEREAS Alaska will experience in the next decade a significant expansion in labor markets, in which new patterns of employment will emerge and new occupational requirements will be demanded; and

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WHEREAS research findings concerning state labor markets and personnel management should be made available, in a clear and understandable form, to Alaska businesses so that these businesses are able to expand through the hiring of reliable, productive Alaska residents; and

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WHEREAS establishment of a Committee on Employment and Productivity by the University of Alaska would ensure that these research findings would be provided to businesses in the state so that programs and policies could be established for the benefit of all employers and employees in the state;

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the University of Alaska is requested to establish a Committee on Employment and Productivity within the Institute of Social and Economic Research; and be it

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FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee on Employment and Productivity conduct, in cooperation with private employers in the state, research and development activities to ensure that all residents of the state are able to benefit from economic growth in the state through suitable employment opportunities and to encourage the growth of business and industry in the state through the provision of a reliable and productive state work force; and be it

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1        FURTHER RESOLVED that the research and development activities of the  
2 Committee on Employment and Productivity be coordinated with, and supportive  
3 of, other governmental and private economic development and employment and  
4 training activities in the state and that the committee make every effort  
5 possible to avoid duplication of these other activities; and be it

6        FURTHER RESOLVED that the Committee on Employment and Productivity  
7 receive money appropriated by the legislature on a matching basis with con-  
8 tributions received by the committee from private individuals and businesses.

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
