5 Requesting the Governor to declare  
6 March 31, 1982, Fred Dickey Day.

7 BE IT RESOLVED BY SENATE:

8 WHEREAS journalistic excellence and accuracy in reporting are qualities  
9 to be aspired to by all members of the news media; and

10 WHEREAS those who most passionately seek achievement of that most coveted  
11 and commendable freedom of the press -- freedom from falsehood -- deserve  
12 special recognition; and

13 WHEREAS, while both during and since Fred Dickey's employment as a  
14 newspaper editor here in Alaska, he battled against enormous odds in trying  
15 to move closer to the above objectives;

16 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Senate commends these laudable  
17 editorial efforts and wishes further to encourage them by respectfully  
18 requesting the Governor to declare March 31, 1982, as Fred Dickey Day; and be

21 requested to cite Fred Dickey's previous employer for his belated recognition  
22 of the need to bring a man of Mr. Dickey's competence, integrity and foresight
