A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to legislative space or facilities;
7 and providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 24.05.090 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 24.05.090. REGULAR SESSIONS. The legislature shall convene
11 at the capital or in the state capitol or at a location approved by
12 the legislature under AS 24.05.190(a) or (c) each year on the second
13 Monday in January at 10:00 a.m.; however, following a gubernatorial
14 election year the legislature shall convene on the third Monday in
15 January at 10:00 a.m. Except as provided in this section, each legis-
16 lature shall have a duration of two years and shall consist of a
17 "First Regular Session" that [WHICH] shall meet in the odd-numbered
18 years and a "Second Regular Session" that [WHICH] shall meet in the
19 even-numbered years and any special session or sessions that [WHICH]
20 the governor or legislature may find necessary to call.

21 * Sec. 2. AS 24.05.190(a) is amended to read:

22 (a) The state capitol, with the exception of the capitol space
23 now occupied by the Office of the Governor, and space occupied in any
24 other [STATE] building by the legislature or its agencies is under the
25 control of and subject to assignment by the Legislative Affairs Agency
26 as directed by the legislature. The Legislative Affairs Agency is
27 responsible for the equitable allocation of parking spaces at the
28 capitol according to the needs of the legislature and other agencies
29 occupying capitol offices. In this subsection, "under the control of"

1 means there is authority over planning, construction, maintenance,
2 occupancy, and operation of any facility, or space within a facility,
3 for the legislature or its agencies; it includes the right of prior
4 approval before (1) acquisition of land or other property; (2) con-
5 tracting for public works as defined in AS 36.95.010; (3) expenditure
6 of public money; and (4) establishing a lease to be entered into for
7 one year or more after completion of a public work, if the acqui-
8 sition, contracting, expenditure, or lease relates to a facility, or
9 space within a facility, for the legislature or its agencies.

10 * Sec. 3. AS 24.05.190 is amended by adding new subsections to read:

11 (c) The legislature may authorize the Legislative Affairs Agency
12 to approve acquisition, construction, or lease of legislative facili-
13 ties in the state capital under this section or in another location in
14 the state where a regular or a special session of the legislature may
15 be held under AS 24.05.090 or 24.05.100(b).

16 (d) The Legislative Affairs Agency shall coordinate with the
17 Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to carry out the
18 provisions of this section.

19 * Sec. 4. AS 24.30.030 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

20 (b) An appropriation bill for a legislative facility or
21 legislative space within a facility must describe the location of the
22 facility, the purpose, and the source of money to be used for land or
23 property acquisition, planning, and construction of the facility.

24 * Sec. 5. AS 35.05.010 is amended to read:

25 Sec. 35.05.010. PLANNING AND CONSTRUCTION. The department is
26 responsible for the planning and construction of public works except
27 as provided for court facilities in AS 22.05.025 and subject to the
28 approval required in AS 24.05.190 for legislative facilities or legis-
29 lative space.

1 * Sec. 6. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.-
2 10.070(c).
