A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act granting general law municipalities the power
7 to provide social services for senior citizens."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 29.48.030(a) is amended by adding a new paragraph to
10 read:

11 (24) health, recreation, housing, and other social services
12 for senior citizens, including facilities for senior citizen programs.

13 * Sec. 2. AS 29.48.030(b) is amended to read:

14 (b) First and second class boroughs may exercise the powers
15 conferred by (a) of this section or AS 29.48.033(a) only after they
16 have been assumed in the manner required under AS 29.33.250 -
17 29.33.290 for areawide exercise or in the manner required under
18 AS 29.38.010 - 29.38.050 for exercise in the borough area outside
19 cities, or are conferred by AS 29.48.020 for exercise in the borough
20 area outside cities. However, as to powers conferred under (a)(12)
21 and (24) of this section, exercise of the powers areawide or in the
22 borough area outside cities is at the option of the borough and is not
23 subject to those restrictions on acquisition of additional borough
24 powers. With respect only to boroughs that [WHICH] on September 10,
25 1972 are not exercising powers conferred under (a)(12) of this section
26 on an areawide basis, objection that [WHICH] a city may raise to
27 areawide exercise of the powers by a borough shall be reviewed by the
28 Alaska Transportation Commission. The commission shall decide whether
29 exercise of the powers exclusively by the borough areawide is to be

1 approved as in the public interest under the particular facts and
2 circumstances at issue.
