6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the use of public money for
7 personal services; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 36.98.010 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 36.98.010. APPLICATION OF CHAPTER. This chapter applies to
12 contracts for professional services provided to a state agency unless

13 (1) the total amount of the contract or contracts awarded
14 to a person does not exceed \$25,000 in a 12-month period;

15 (2) the contract is an employment contract for services to
16 be performed under direct supervision regardless of the existence of
17 an employer-employee relationship and a written justification signed
18 by the person responsible for awarding the contract is filed with the
19 commissioner;

20 (3) the contract is awarded based on competitive bids
21 obtained under the procedure provided in AS 37.05.230.

22 * Sec. 2. USE OF PUBLIC FUNDS TO PAY NONRESIDENTS. (a) The state may
23 not spend public money to employ or contract with a nonresident person to
24 provide expertise or professional services to the state unless a written
25 report is filed with the Department of Administration. The report shall
26 include a brief description of the work to be done by the nonresident
27 person, the reasons why the state failed to identify an Alaskan person and
28 the effort made to locate a qualified Alaskan person. The legislative
29 audit division shall prepare the forms necessary to comply with this

1 section.

2 (b) In this section "state" includes any state department, state
3 agency, and state university.

4 * Sec. 3. Contracts that are exempt from the provisions of AS 36.98 as
5 provided in AS 36.98.010(1) are exempt from the provisions of sec. 2 of
6 this Act.

7 * Sec. 4. Sections 2 and 3 of this Act are repealed July 1, 1985.

8 * Sec. 5. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.-
9 10.070(c).
