6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to barbers and hairdressers; and  
7 providing for an effective date."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

14 created the Board of Barbers and Hairdressers consisting of seven

18 this chapter or under former AS 08.12 for at least three years;

19 (2) two persons who have been licensed as hairdressers  
20 under this chapter or under former AS 08.28 for at least three years;

23 chapter or former AS 08.12 or former AS 08.28 for at least three  
24 years; and

25 (4) one public member.
