Sec. 08.80.030. POWERS OF THE BOARD. The board may

(1) elect a president and secretary from its membership and

adopt rules for the conduct of its business;

agent, for violations of this chapter, or of any other state or

3 Sec. 08.80.095. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY. The board may hire an
4 executive secretary to assist in implementing this chapter. The
5 executive secretary shall be a member of the partially exempt service
6 under AS 39.25.120.

7 Sec. 08.80.097. INVESTIGATIONS. (a) The executive secretary
8 may inspect pharmacies and investigate complaints to determine whether
9 any person has violated this chapter or AS 17.30 or a regulation
10 adopted under either chapter or to secure information useful in the
11 administration of either chapter.

12 (b) If the executive secretary believes that a person may have
13 engaged in or be about to engage in an act or practice in violation of
14 this chapter or AS 17.30 or a regulation adopted under either chapter,
15 the executive secretary shall investigate the matter in accordance
16 with this chapter or AS 17.30 and immediately send written notice of
17 the investigation to each board member and to the department.
