BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS the Republic of China is of great strategic importance in the
9 defense of East Asia and the Pacific; and

WHEREAS the Republic of China has developed a prosperous and success-
11 ful free economy while surmounting great difficulties; and

12

WHEREAS Alaskans share the same spirit and economic goals as the
13 Taiwanese; and

14

WHEREAS the United States government has encouraged people-to-people
15 contacts since 1956 when President Eisenhower began that program; and

16

WHEREAS the City of Fairbanks has had a sister city relationship with
17 the City of Tainan, Taiwan, Republic of China since August 1982; and

18

WHEREAS the people of the province of Taiwan have established them-
19 selves as great producers of products sold in the world market and Alaska
20 is the source of many of the raw materials required for those products; and

WHEREAS the Republic of China has been a loyal ally of the United
22 States for more than 70 years; and

WHEREAS a sister state relationship with strong economic ties is in
24 the mutual interest of Taiwan and Alaska;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that an invitation be
26 extended to the people of Taiwan through their Provincial Legislature to be
27 a sister state with the State of Alaska, with strong social, educational,
28 economic, and cultural exchange programs; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the people of Alaska and Taiwan should work

1 closely together to improve international goodwill and understanding.

2 COPIES of this resolution shall be sent to Mr. Teng-hui Lee, Governor
3 of Taiwan and to Yu-jen Kao, Speaker of the Provincial Legislature of
4 Taiwan; and to the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Frank Murkowski,
5 U.S. Senators, and the Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative, members of
6 the Alaska delegation in Congress.
