3 IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

4 THIRTEENTH LEGISLATURE - SECOND SESSION

5 Relating to the assignment to Alaska of
6 the rapid deployment light infantry
7 division.

8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 WHEREAS Alaska is in a very real sense the mineral and resource store-
10 house for the Nation; and

11 WHEREAS the value of Alaska's resources to the Nation is inestimable;
12 and

13 WHEREAS Alaska is located in a geographically strategic position; and

14 WHEREAS the Congress of the United States is currently deliberating
15 the location of a new 10,000 man rapid deployment light infantry division;
16 and

17 WHEREAS Alaska's resource wealth requires the maximum security avail-
18 able; and

19 WHEREAS Alaska's strategic geographic position would enhance the
20 Nation's ability to respond to military crises in a timely manner; and

21 WHEREAS Alaska and its communities have always welcomed and enjoyed a
22 close, positive relationship with military personnel and their dependents
23 in the state; and

24 WHEREAS Alaska and its people would benefit from the presence and
25 added security of the new light infantry division in the state;

26 BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature requests the Governor
27 and the state's Congressional delegation to make every effort to encourage
28 the Congress to locate the new 10,000 man light infantry division in Alaska
29 to the benefit of both the Nation and the state.
