6 For an Act entitled: "An Act to restrict nighttime driving of motor

7

vehicles by minors."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 28.15 is amended by adding a new section to read:

10

Sec. 28.15.173. RESTRICTION ON NIGHTTIME DRIVING BY MINORS. (a)

11

Except as provided in (b) of this section, a person under the age of

12

18 years may not drive a motor vehicle upon the highways of the state

13

between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. the evenings of Sunday through Thursday and

14

between 12 midnight and 6 a.m. the evenings of Friday and Saturday

15

unless accompanied by a person 21 years of age or older, a spouse 18

16

years of age or older, a parent, or a person in loco parentis.

(b) A person under 18 years of age may drive a motor vehicle

18

upon the highways of the state between the hours set out in (a) of

19

this section between the driver's home and employment or in the course

20

of employment if carrying an affidavit signed by the employer indicat-

21

ing the employment schedule. If the driver's employment is ter-

22

minated, the driver shall surrender the affidavit to the employer.

23

(c) A person who violates (a) of this section is subject to the

24

license suspension or revocation provisions of AS 28.15.181.

(b) A court convicting a person of an offense under (a)(1) - (4)

1     or [,] (6) - (8) [, OR (7)] of this section shall revoke that person's  
2     driver's license for a period of not less than 30 days for the first  
3     conviction, unless the court determines that the person's ability to  
4     earn a livelihood would be severely impaired and a limitation under  
5     AS 28.15.201 can be placed on the license which will enable the person  
6     to earn a livelihood without excessive risk or danger to the public.  
7     If a court limits a person's license under this subsection, it shall  
8     do so for a period of not less than 30 days. Upon a subsequent con-  
9     viction of a person for any offense under (a)(1) - (4) or [,] (6) -  
10    (8) [, OR (7)] of this section, the court shall revoke the person's  
11    license and may not grant the person any limited license privileges  
12    for the following periods:

- 13                 (1) not less than one year for the second conviction; and  
14                 (2) not less than three years for a third or subsequent  
15    conviction.
