6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the delegation of department head  
7 membership on boards, commissions, and other units of  
8 the state government."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. AS 44.17.010 is amended by adding a new subsection to  
11 read:

12 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a principal  
13 executive officer of a state department who is appointed under statu-  
14 tory mandate to serve as a member of a board, commission, public  
15 authority, public corporation, or other unit of state government may  
16 assign the duties, powers, and privileges of the membership to a  
17 subordinate employee who has status at least equivalent to division  
18 director, subject to the approval of the governor. A delegation of  
19 membership under this subsection must be in writing and is effective  
20 until the principal executive officer revokes the delegation, resigns  
21 or otherwise forfeits office, or is no longer qualified to be a mem-  
22 ber. A principal executive officer of a state department who makes a  
23 delegation of membership under this subsection must also notify the  
24 legislature of the delegation in writing. A delegation of membership  
25 under this subsection may be nullified by a concurrent resolution of  
26 the legislature adopted within 30 legislative days after notification  
27 of the delegation of membership.
