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A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to trespassing and posting of land."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 34 is amended by adding a new chapter to read:

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CHAPTER 52. TRESPASS AND POSTING OF LAND.

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Sec. 34.52.010. NO TRESPASSING NOTICE. The owner, lessee, or person lawfully in possession of real property in the state desiring to prevent trespass or entry onto the real property shall post notices in conspicuous places parallel to and along the exterior boundary of the property to be protected, at each roadway or other way of access, and if the property is not fenced, the notices shall be posted every 500 feet along the exterior boundaries of the property.

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Sec. 34.52.020. CONTENTS OF THE NOTICE. A notice posted under AS 34.52.010 shall prohibit all persons from trespassing or entering upon the property without the permission of the owner, a lessee, a person in lawful possession of the property, or an agent of the owner, a lessee, or a person in lawful possession of the property. The notices shall

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(1) be printed legibly in English;

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(2) be at least 144 square inches in size;

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(3) contain the name and address of the person under whose authority the property is posted and the name and address of the person who is authorized to grant permission to enter the property;

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(4) be placed at each roadway or apparent way of access onto the property in addition to the boundary; and

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1 (5) state, where applicable, any specific prohibition that
2 the posting is directed against such as "no trespassing," "no hunt-
3 ing," "no fishing," "no digging," or any other specific prohibition.

4 Sec. 34.52.030. POSTING PUBLIC LAND. A person who knowingly
5 posts public land contrary to state or federal law or regulation is
6 guilty of a class B misdemeanor.
