Requesting that Birch Creek and Beaver

Creek be removed from designation as

wild rivers.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

WHEREAS Birch Creek and Beaver Creek were designated as wild rivers by

10

Sec. 603 of the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act (ANILCA),

P.L. 96-487; and

WHEREAS both creeks are located in parts of Alaska with a long history

13

of mining activity; and

14

WHEREAS mining exploration and development has traditionally been and

15

presently is a vital part of the economy of Interior Alaska; and

16

WHEREAS the wild river designation imposed by ANILCA may result in the

17

curtailment of existing mining activity and prevent its future expansion;

18

and

WHEREAS the designation of Birch Creek and Beaver Creek as wild rivers

20

is wholly inappropriate;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Alaska State Legislature respectfully requests

the United States Congress to amend Sec. 603 of ANILCA by deleting Birch

23

Creek and Beaver Creek from designation as wild rivers.
