A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to permits for concealed weapons."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 11.61.220(a) is amended to read:

9 (a) A person commits the crime of misconduct involving weapons
10 in the third degree if the person

11 (1) knowingly possesses a deadly weapon, other than an
12 ordinary pocket knife, that is concealed on the person and does not
13 have a valid permit to carry a concealed weapon issued under AS 18.-
14 98.010;

15 (2) knowingly possesses a loaded firearm on the person in
16 any place where intoxicating liquor is sold for consumption on the
17 premises; or

18 (3) being an unemancipated minor under 16 years of age,
19 possesses a firearm without the consent of a parent or guardian of the
20 minor.

21 * Sec. 2. AS 18 is amended by adding a new chapter to read:

22 CHAPTER 98. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

23 Sec. 18.98.010. PERMIT FOR CONCEALED WEAPON. (a) The Depart-
24 ment of Public Safety shall, within 30 days after the filing of an
25 application and payment of a \$15 application fee, issue to a qualified
26 applicant a permit to carry a weapon concealed on the person for the
27 purpose of self-protection. A permit to carry a concealed weapon must
28 contain the following information:

29 (1) the name and address of the permittee;

- 1 (2) a physical description of the permittee;
- 2 (3) the thumbprints of the permittee;
- 3 (4) the reason given by the permittee for wanting a permit;
- 4 (5) the signature of the permittee;
- 5 (6) the expiration date of the permit; and
- 6 (7) a photograph of the permittee.

7 (b) An applicant who is at least 21 years of age and passes an
8 examination of eyesight is qualified to receive a permit under this
9 section unless the applicant

10 (1) has been convicted of a felony by any court and the
11 conviction has not been set aside by a pardon or post-conviction
12 proceedings;

13 (2) is addicted to the use of alcohol or any other drug; or
14 (3) has been adjudicated mentally incompetent or insane by
15 a court of competent jurisdiction and not thereafter declared compe-
16 tent.

17 (c) A conviction or adjudication that would disqualify an appli-
18 cant for a permit under this section also disqualifies a permittee and
19 automatically terminates the permit to carry a concealed weapon.

20 (d) The Department of Public Safety shall preserve a copy of
21 each permit to carry a concealed weapon for at least six years after
22 the permit is issued. The permit is in effect for two years after it
23 is issued.

24 (e) The Department of Public Safety may adopt regulations to
25 carry out this section.
