For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to school boards of regional
educational attendance areas."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 14.08.051(d) is amended to read:

10

(d) Multi-member sections may be created. However,

11

(1) each seat on the regional board shall be designated by
letter or number and when the declaration of candidacy or other nomi-
nation papers of a candidate for the regional school board are filed
those papers must indicate the seat that the candidate seeks; and

(2) except as provided in (f) of this section, a [NO]
section may not be represented by more than

(A) three members, if a board consists of five

15

members;

16

(B) four members, if a board consists of seven

17

members;

(C) five members, if a board consists of nine members;

or

(D) six members, if a board consists of 11 members.

* Sec. 2. AS 14.08.051 is amended by adding new subsections to read:

(f) The commissioner may permit a section that contains more
than one community to be represented by more board members than the
number set out in (d)(2) of this section if the commissioner deter-
mines that

(1) the regional educational attendance area has had a

1 pattern of substantial population fluctuations between geographic
2 areas within the regional educational attendance area; and

3 (2) compliance with the requirements of (d)(2) of this
4 section could result in continuous underrepresentation and overrep-
5 resentation of sections.

6 (g) In a regional educational attendance area section subject to
7 (f) of this section, no more than two members may be elected from the
8 same community.
