A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act creating the Alaska Power Administration
7 Transfer Commission; and providing for an effective
8 date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. COMMISSION ESTABLISHED. The Alaska Power Administration
11 Transfer Commission is established in the Department of Commerce and Eco-
12 nomic Development.

13 * Sec. 2. MEMBERSHIP. (a) The governor shall appoint six members to
14 the commission who shall be the following:

- 15 (1) a member of the Alaska State Senate;
16 (2) a member of the Alaska State House of Representatives;
17 (3) an attorney who is not a member of the legislature;
18 (4) a fiscal expert who is not a member of the legislature;
19 (5) a public member; and
20 (6) a representative of the governor.

21 (b) The administrator of the Alaska Power Administration may serve as
22 an ex-officio member of the commission.

23 * Sec. 3. COMPENSATION. Members serve without compensation but are
24 entitled to travel and per diem authorized for members of boards and
25 commissions under AS 39.20.180.

26 * Sec. 4. PROCEDURES. (a) The membership shall elect a chair and a
27 vice-chair. The chair may appoint standing and special committees and
28 subcommittees.

29 (b) The commission shall meet each month or more often as needed. A

1 quorum consists of four members and must include either the chair or the
2 vice-chair of the commission.

3 * Sec. 5. DUTIES. The commission shall research and analyze

4 (1) the fiscal condition of the administration;

5 (2) the operation of the administration;

6 (3) the advantages and disadvantages of the state purchasing the
7 assets and operating the projects of the administration;

8 (4) the possible terms for an acquisition by the state of the
9 assets of the administration.

10 * Sec. 6. POWERS OF THE COMMISSION. The commission may

11 (1) conduct research, hold public hearings, and study related
12 issues in order to accomplish its duties;

13 (2) hire staff as necessary; and

14 (3) take other actions necessary or proper to carry out its
15 duties.

16 * Sec. 7. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT. The Administrative Procedure
17 Act (AS 44.62) does not apply to proceedings of the commission.

18 * Sec. 8. REPORT. The commission shall submit a report to the federal
19 legislature of its findings under sec. 5 of this Act by January 15, 1986.

20 * Sec. 9. DEFINITION. In this Act "administration" means the federal
21 Alaska Power Administration.

22 * Sec. 10. This Act is repealed January 16, 1986.

23 * Sec. 11. This Act takes effect immediately in accordance with AS 01.-
24 10.070(c).
