6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to absences from the state for  
7 purposes of disqualification for a longevity bonus;  
8 and providing for an effective date."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. AS 47.45.030 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 47.45.030. ABSENCE FROM THE STATE. After qualification, a  
12 recipient shall notify the commissioner of administration when the  
13 recipient expects to be absent from the state if the absence is for a  
14 continuous period that exceeds 30 days. After that notification, the  
15 recipient may no longer receive bonuses from the Department of  
16 Administration after the last regularly approved monthly application.  
17 Upon returning to the state, the recipient may again make application  
18 for a bonus. Whenever the absence is for a continuous period that  
19 exceeds 180 [90] days the recipient shall be disqualified from  
20 receiving bonuses for the next 12 calendar months after returning to  
21 the state. However, when the commissioner of administration  
22 determines a period of absence is beyond the control of the recipient,  
23 the recipient may not be disqualified if the recipient still otherwise  
24 qualifies upon returning to the state. Continual absences from the  
25 state, even though reported, and failure to notify the commissioner of  
26 an expected absence may be grounds for disqualification.
