A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to membership on the Alcoholic
7 Beverage Control Board."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 04.06.020 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 04.06.020. APPOINTMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS. The board
11 consists of seven [FIVE] members appointed by the governor and con-
12 firmed by a majority of the members of the legislature in joint ses-
13 sion. A member of the board may not hold any other state or federal
14 office, either elective or appointive. Two members of the board shall
15 be persons actively engaged in the alcoholic beverage industry, except
16 that a [NO] member may not hold a wholesale license or be an officer,
17 agent, or employee of a wholesale alcoholic beverage enterprise. Two
18 members shall be knowledgeable in the diagnosis or treatment of alco-
19 hol or substance abuse problems. Three members shall be public
20 members who are not presently and have not previously engaged in the
21 alcohol industry. No three members of the board may be engaged in the
22 same business, occupation, or profession.

23 * Sec. 2. AS 04.06.060 is amended to read:

24 Sec. 04.06.060. QUORUM AND MAJORITY. Four [THREE] members of
25 the board constitute a quorum for the conduct of business, except that
26 a majority of the whole membership of the board must approve all
27 applications for new licenses, and all renewals, transfers, suspens-
28 ions and revocations of existing licenses. If a majority of the board
29 is present and voting, the director, with the consent of the members

1 present, may cast a tie-breaking vote.

2 * Sec. 3. Notwithstanding the amendments made to AS 04.06.020 by sec. 1
3 of this Act, a member serving on the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board on
4 the effective date of this Act may continue to serve until the member's
5 term expires.
