A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the adoption of bylaws by a
7 cooperative."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 10.25.070 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 10.25.070. BYLAWS. The board of directors shall adopt the
11 first bylaws of a cooperative to be adopted following an incorpora-
12 tion, conversion, merger or consolidation. Thereafter the [MEMBERS
13 OR] district delegates in cooperatives having three or more districts
14 that are not connected by a road system to another district of the
15 cooperative may [SHALL] adopt, amend, or repeal the bylaws by the
16 affirmative vote of a majority of the [THOSE MEMBERS OR] district
17 delegates voting on the adoption, amendment, or repeal at a meeting of
18 the [MEMBERS OR] district delegates. In all other cooperatives the
19 members shall adopt, amend, or repeal the bylaws by the affirmative
20 vote of a majority of the members voting on the adoption, amendment,
21 or repeal either at a meeting of the members or by mail ballot without
22 a meeting. The bylaws shall set out [FORTH] the rights and duties of
23 members, district delegates, and directors and may contain other
24 provisions for the regulation and management of the affairs of the
25 cooperative consistent [NOT INCONSISTENT] with this chapter or with
26 the [ITS] articles of incorporation of the cooperative.

27 * Sec. 2. AS 10.25.120 is amended to read:

28 Sec. 10.25.120. VOTING. Each member is entitled to one vote on
29 each matter submitted to a vote (1) at a meeting of the members or (2)

1 by mail ballot permitted by AS 10.25.070. Each member of a district
2 is entitled to one vote on each matter submitted to a vote at a [ANY]
3 district meeting. Voting at a meeting shall be in person, but, if the
4 bylaws so provide, may also be by mail.
