A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to truancy."

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 * Section 1. AS 14.30.020 is amended to read:

9 Sec. 14.30.020. VIOLATION. A person violating AS 14.30.010 is
10 guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of
11 not less than \$50 nor more than \$200, plus the cost of prosecution,
12 and may be imprisoned until the fine and costs are paid or until the
13 convicted person has served one day for every \$2 of the fine and
14 costs, at which time the fine and costs are automatically discharged.
15 Each unlawful absence is a violation and if an absence is extensive
16 there is a new violation each time five consecutive days of the
17 absence elapse. The court may suspend sentence, stay or postpone
18 enforcement of execution, or release from custody a person found
19 guilty upon the conditions which are in the best interests of the
20 child. [IN ANY EVENT, AT THE EXPIRATION OF THE SCHOOL YEAR, THE
21 PERSON SHALL BE RELEASED AND DISCHARGED FROM ALL PENALTIES PROVIDED BY
22 THIS SECTION.]
