9 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 \* Section 1. Rule 39(c) of the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legis-  
11 lature is amended to read:

12 (c) Second Reading. When a bill appears on the calendar for  
13 second reading it is read in the same manner as in the first reading  
14 unless the members present order by a majority vote of the full mem-  
15 bership of the house that it be read in full. When the second reading  
16 of the bill is completed, [AND] the accompanying committee report and  
17 all accompanying letters of intent are read, and, in the case of an  
18 appropriation bill, any expression of intent contained in the body of  
19 the bill is read [IS COMPLETED] the bill is then before the house for  
20 amendment. If a proposed amendment is tabled it does not carry with  
21 it or prejudice the bill. When all amendments have been made the  
22 presiding officer directs the clerk or secretary to have the bill  
23 engrossed with all amendments approved by the house and to certify its  
24 proper engrossment on the following legislative day. When the clerk  
25 or secretary reports the bill back properly engrossed it is then  
26 delivered to the Rules Committee for placement on the calendar for  
27 third reading and final consideration. A house may, by a  
28 three-fourths vote of the full membership of the house, order that the  
29 bill be considered engrossed upon the completion of the second reading

1       for the purpose of advancing it from second to third reading on the  
2       same day.
