7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

8 WHEREAS Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 mandates equal  
9 opportunities for women in federally funded educational programs and activ-  
10 ities; and

11 WHEREAS the recent United States Supreme Court case of Grove City  
12 College v. Bell interpreted Title IX to cover only the specific program or  
13 activity in which discrimination occurs, thus allowing a school to receive  
14 federal funds for one program even though it discriminates in another  
15 program; and

16 WHEREAS this case seriously affects the civil rights of women and  
17 threatens the civil rights of minorities, the disabled, and the elderly  
18 under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, sec. 504 of the Rehabilita-  
19 tion Act of 1973, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975; and

20 WHEREAS the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1985 (H.R. 700 and S. 431)  
21 would, if enacted, restore legal protections against discrimination as  
22 intended by Congress;

23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Alaska State Legislature that the United States  
24 Congress is urged to pass the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1985 as soon  
25 as possible; and be it

26 FURTHER RESOLVED that the Alaska delegation in Congress is urged to  
27 co-sponsor the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1985.

4 the Honorable Ted Stevens and the Honorable Frank Murkowski, U.S. Senators,  
5 and the Honorable Don Young, U.S. Representative, members of the Alaska  
6 delegation in Congress.
