A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the violation of compulsory
7 education laws."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Sec. 1. AS 14.30.020 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 14.30.020. VIOLATION. A person violating AS 14.30.010 is
11 guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction is punishable by a fine of
12 not less than \$50 nor more than \$200, plus the cost of prosecution,
13 and may be imprisoned until the fine and costs are paid or until the
14 convicted person has served one day for every \$2 of the fine and
15 costs, at which time the fine and costs are automatically discharged.
16 Each unlawful absence is a violation and if an absence is extensive
17 there is a new violation each time five consecutive days of the
18 absence elapse. The court may suspend sentence, stay or postpone
19 enforcement of execution, or release from custody a person found
20 guilty upon the conditions which are in the best interests of the
21 child. [IN ANY EVENT, AT THE EXPIRATION OF THE SCHOOL YEAR, THE
22 PERSON SHALL BE RELEASED AND DISCHARGED FROM ALL PENALTIES PROVIDED BY
23 THIS SECTION.]
