A BILL

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to eligibility for longevity bonus  
7 payments."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. AS 47.45.030 is amended to read:

10 Sec. 47.45.030. ABSENCE FROM THE STATE. After qualification, a  
11 recipient shall notify the commissioner of administration when the  
12 recipient expects to be absent from the state if the absence is for a  
13 continuous period that exceeds 60 [30] days. After that notification,  
14 the recipient may no longer receive bonuses from the Department of  
15 Administration after the last regularly approved monthly application.  
16 Upon returning to the state, the recipient may again make application  
17 for a bonus. Whenever the absence is for a continuous period that  
18 exceeds 180 days the recipient shall be disqualified from receiving  
19 bonuses for the next 12 calendar months after returning to the state.  
20 However, when the commissioner of administration determines a period  
21 of absence is beyond the control of the recipient, the recipient may  
22 not be disqualified if the recipient still otherwise qualifies upon  
23 returning to the state. Continual absences from the state, even  
24 though reported, and failure to notify the commissioner of an expected  
25 absence may be grounds for disqualification.
