8 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 \* Section 1. Rule 37(a) of the Uniform Rules of the Alaska State Legis-  
10 lature is amended to read:

(a) Any member, group of members, standing, special, or joint

committee may introduce a bill, subject to the provisions of these

13

Uniform Rules. A member may introduce not more than 10 bills during

14

an entire legislature except if the member withdraws a bill introduced

15

by that legislator another bill on any subject may be introduced

16

without regard to the subject matter of the withdrawn bill. The prime

17

sponsor of a bill is the member introducing the bill. A bill must be

18

introduced, in proper form as approved by the enrolling secretary of

19

the legislature, with the original and two carbon copies delivered to

20

the chief clerk or secretary. The bill is then assigned a number

21

which it retains through subsequent changes and substitutions. The

22

bill is considered formally introduced when the clerk or secretary

23

reads the heading and title aloud in open session (first reading).

24

Bills may be introduced through the Rules Committees by the governor

25

and the permanent interim committees pursuant to provisions of law.
